Our world relies on an intricate system of transport, communication and trade to bring food from the fields to our tables, but any system is subject to flaws and can buckle under stress.

Economy

World financial system built as 'new idolatry,' cardinal tells forum - Catholic News Service

The world financial system "has been built as a new idolatry," charged Cardinal Oscar Rodriguez Maradiaga of Tegucigalpa, Honduras, at a June 3 forum in Washington sponsored by The Catholic University of America's Institute for Policy Research & Catholic Studies. During his keynote address, Cardinal Rodriguez issued a ringing endorsement of the church's competency to critique economic systems.

Peace

Water and Conflict in Syria - Pacific Institute

Drought, Water and Agricultural Management, and Climatic Conditions are Factors in the Syrian Conflict. A foreign policy that supports Israel regardless of what Israel does to Palestinians trapped in Gaza or forced into Bantustans in the West Bank creates anti-US sentiment. When US weaponry, whether wielded by American forces or by American clients, is killing civilians in places like eastern Libya, Gaza, and Sinai, anti-US sentiment will increase. American patronage of authoritarian Middle Eastern regimes absolutely creates anti-American sentiment. ...unless America embarks on some hard choices about holding its allies to the same standards it demands of its enemies, its reputation will continue to suffer.

Hours before he convened an unprecedented Vatican prayer service for peace in the Middle East, Pope Francis told a crowd gathered in St. Peter's Square that "a church that doesn't have the capacity to surprise ... is a dying church."

Migration

Of Tears and Terror Families Torn Apart By Community Raids in the New Orleans Area - Just South Quarterly The family holds a central place in Catholic Social Teaching. Key Church teachings describe the family as "the sanctuary of life," the "essential cell of human society," and the "domestic Church." Given the primacy of the

family in the spiritual, ethical, social, and emotional formation of children, the unprecedented increase in deportations since President Obama took office is deeply disturbing. An Urban Institute study found that one child was left behind for every two immigrants apprehended by immigration authorities in worksite raids.

<u>US Bishop urges Congress to protect unaccompanied child migrants</u>-Independent Catholic News Bishop Eusebio Elizondo, auxiliary bishop of Seattle and chairman of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Migration, called upon the Administration and Congress to protect unaccompanied children from Mexico and Central America crossing the border and to respond to the root causes of poverty and increasing violence as a long-term solution to the issue.

FBI recovers 168 children in child sex trafficking sting - BBC

Authorities rescued 168 children and arrested 281 alleged pimps in cities across the US in a week-long child sex-trafficking sting, the FBI has said.

Environment

U.S. moves to boost energy in Nigeria, others - Nigeria Guardian News

The U.S. has announced a new energy innovation tagged ``Beyond the Grid" to boost energy and address supply shortages in Nigeria and five other African countries. The U.S. Secretary for Energy, Ernest Moniz, said this on Wednesday at the ongoing U.S.-Africa Energy Ministerial conference in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The theme of the conference is Power Africa Beyond the Grid: Increasing Access through Small-Scale Energy Solution.

China Bulldozing Hundreds Of Mountains To Expand Cities - Thinkprogress Press

China is just about the same size as the United States, but livable land is in short supply. With the population and economy still growing at a rapid clip, the government has undertaken a plan to bulldoze hundreds of mountains to create land for building on.

Church

<u>US Bishops urge action on carbon pollution to stem climate change</u> - Independent Catholic News Catholic bishops in the United States have urged the US Environmental Protection Agency "to develop standards to reduce carbon pollution from existing power plants and thereby mitigate climate change" in a May 29 letter from Archbishop Thomas G Wenski of Miami, chairman of the Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Pope sacks entire board of Vatican financial authority - Independent Catholic News

The Vatican said the Pope named four experts from Switzerland, Singapore, the United States and Italy to replace them on the board of the Financial Information Authority (AIF), the Holy See's internal regulatory office.

U.S. Bishops Seek to Match Vatican in Shifting Tone - The New York Times

They are rethinking what kinds of houses they live in, and what kinds of cars they drive. They are wondering whether, in anticipation of the 2016 presidential election, they need to rewrite their advice to parishioners to make sure that poverty, and not just abortion, is discussed as a high-priority issue. And they are trying to get

better about returning phone calls, reaching out to the disenchanted and the disenfranchised, and showing up at events.

COUNTRY UPDATES

Brazil

Brazil Security Forces Shoot Peaceful Indigenous Protesters with Rubber Bullets - Amazon Watch Over 150 indigenous people began a new peaceful protest of construction of the Belo Monte Dam complex in Brazil. Demanding respect for their legal rights and the fulfillment of government agreements to construct schools and healthcare facilities, protesters blocked access to construction workers. According to the protesters, an agreement made over three years ago to provide assistance to communities displaced by the dam's construction has yet to be fulfilled. They also assert that the Brazilian Institute of the Environment (IBAMA) has never visited the village to assess the fulfillment of the conditions of the agreement.

<u>Brazilian bishops give government, World Cup organizers 'red card'</u> - Catholic News Service
The Brazilian bishops' conference has given the government and 2014 FIFA World Cup organizers a "red card" for putting the competition above the Brazilian people's basic needs. In soccer, a "red card" is given to players who commit serious fouls and are expelled from the game.

Congo

The Democratic Republic Of Congo Paradox: Time to Think the Unthinkable - AFJN

DRC customs office in Uviraln November 2013, a report, known as "the Simon Nyandu Report" after the nation's Attorney General, was completed but never officially released. The DRC government attempted to suppress it, but it was leaked. The investigators concluded 11 companies illegally avoided \$741 million in taxes and fines often with the collusion of local customs officials. After just 10 days, the Nyandu commission was ordered to stop its investigation and return to Kinshasa without completing its work.

Japan

Climate Legislation Up Against 'Abenomics' in Japan - InterPress Service

Undaunted by Japan's national consensus to boost the economy, which has been mired in lackluster growth for decades, environmentalists are taking baby steps towards incorporating climate change into national legislation.

Daniel Njau, a small-scale farmer from Nyeri County, central Kenya, is torn. He just may have to give up his six-hectare tea plantation in favour of farming climate-resilient food crops. "Tea is very sensitive to climate change. Any drastic weather changes spell doom for the cash crop.

Dozens massacred in Kenya attack- Daily Nation

At least 48 people were killed when suspected Shebab militants from Somalia stormed into a Kenyan coastal town and launched a major assault on a police station, hotels and government offices, officials said.

15 killed in fresh Mpeketoni attack - Daily Nation

Another attack in Mpeketoni left at least 15 people, including two police officers killed, police have confirmed.

Nigeria

Nigeria Has Been Stumbling In Its Fight Against Boko Haram - Think Progress

Militants disguised as members of the Nigerian army believed to be members of the Boko Haram terrorist group attacked a church in the northeastern state of Borno, killing dozens. Witnesses report they also captured three villages near the border with Cameroon. This violent episode is part of an ongoing string of terrorist attacks throughout northern Nigeria that, despite receiving U.S. support, the Nigerian government is struggling to address.
