70 Years After Hiroshima - President Trinity University

August 6, 1945 — the effective end of World War II in the Pacific, the beginning of the long cold era of international nuclear threats even amid the horrific suffering of the people of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The United States is the only nation in human history ever to use a nuclear weapon. The weapon ended a long and terrible war, thus leading many people to justify its use even today. But the "A-bomb" also inflicted such awesome death and destruction on the Japanese people that subsequent generations of Americans, including successive presidents from both parties, have felt the urgent need to exert leadership to ensure that no nation ever again uses nuclear force.

The death toll among refugees attempting to reach the UK from Calais has risen dramatically in recent days. Medical staff in France say they are struggling to cope with the number of seriously injured migrants who are taking ever greater risks to get into the Channel Tunnel.

Former asylum seeker and refugee, Vietnamese-born Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM has called on all Australians to show the same kind of generosity shown to him and his family when they were forced to flee their homeland after the fall of Saigon and the Communist take-over.

Judge orders immigrant families released from detention - AZ Central

A federal judge in California has ordered the government to release immigrant children from family detention centers "without unnecessary delay," and with their mothers when possible, according to court papers. In a filing late Friday, California U.S. District Judge Dolly Gee refused the government's request to reconsider her ruling in late July that children held in family detention centers after crossing the US-Mexico border illegally must be released rapidly.

Sold for \$90: The Girl Who Went from Slave to CEO - Real Leaders

At age seven, Rani Hong was taken from her mother by a kindly neighbor who promised to give her an education, something her poverty-stricken family could never afford. After a few months, Hong disappeared, sold into slavery by her supposed caregivers, who were actually a front for a child slavery syndicate. It would be 21 years before Hong would see her mother again.

Vatican conference on damaging impact of mining - Independent Catholic News
The Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace recieved an open letter on Thursday from CIDSE, (an alliance of 18 Catholic aid and development agencies) which was written by communities in Latin America affected by mining operations. The affected communities recently participated in a meeting called 'In union with God we hear a plea', organized by CIDSE and the Latin American network, Iglesias y Mineria (Churches and Mining). The open letter follows:

<u>Mining Giant Credits Activists with Possibly Saving Great Barrier Reef</u> - Common Dreams Indian mining giant Adani lashes out at environmentalists who sought to block giant coal mine—and succeeded.

Rev. John Rausch, glmy was invited to attend a gathering in Rome, "In Union With God We Hear a Plea," to discuss mining practices with representatives of communities affected by mining activities around the world. The meeting was sponsored by the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace (PCJP) from July 17-19, 2015.

In 2013 certain mine executives asked to meet with PCJP for a dialogue about mining practices, principally because Catholic groups and international organizations were raising questions about the treatment of workers, dangers to local communities and threats to the earth itself. They offered to discuss with priests the positive contributions of mining, because the world needs metals. Two meetings, one in London and one in Rome, started the dialogue with a third scheduled again in Rome for September 2015. Vowed religious groups of men and women, especially Franciscans, urged the PCJP to convene a meeting also of grass roots folks to complement the meetings with business executives. That was the meeting I attended, July 17-19.

<u>Pilgrimage to heart of the Amazon to remember Sr Dorothy Stang</u> - Independent Catholic News A group of priests, religious and laypeople has completed a long trek to the heart of the Amazon to mark the tenth anniversary of the assassination of Sister Dorothy Stang, who dedicated her life to the people there and the protection of their home, the Amazon jungle - the 'lungs of the world'. The mission, from the Archdiocese of Mariana, in the Prelature of Xingu, in Pará, lasted 15 days.

Congo

Nine year olds being trained as terrorists - Independent Catholic News

Jihadist camps made up of nearly 1,500 children as young as nine have been uncovered in central Africa, according to reports received by a leading Catholic charity at work in the region.

This appeal was made by the President of the Episcopal Conference of the the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Bishop Nicola Djomo, at the opening ceremony of a meeting of Pan-African Catholic Youth and Children that is being held in Kinshasa, DRC from August 21-25, 2 015.

Peru

Eradication spells misery for Peru's coca farmers - Washington Post

Edma Duran uses a machete to salvage what leaves she can from the family's coca plot, which government workers have just destroyed in a record-breaking U.S.-backed eradication campaign that has affected roughly a half million Peruvians. "This is what we live off," says Duran, who lives with her husband and six children in a village of 110 people that lacks electricity, phones and running water and is five hours from the nearest doctor. Duran is among thousands of Peruvians who have lost their livelihoods to the government's campaign to destroy the plant used to make cocaine. They say officials have offered only paltry compensation, or none at all.
