Advocates, mostly African diaspora, gathered on March 15 in the Rayburn House Office Building on Capitol Hill to call attention to the tragic effects of land grabbing in Africa by foreign investors. The discussion was moderated by Gregory Simpkins, senior advisor to Congressman Chris Smith, the Chairman of the U.S. House Subcommittee on Africa, Global Health, Global Human Rights and International Organizations.

#### **Peace**

Hundreds of anti-drone protesters march against UK flight-control centre britain - The Guardian Marchers protest the navigation from RAF Waddington of unmanned Reaper aircraft in Afghanistan. Hundreds of peace campaigners gathered outside an RAF base to protest against armed drones being operated from Britain to conduct missions in Afghanistan. Around 400 demonstrators took part in a march from Lincoln to a rally at nearby RAF Waddington, which assumed control of British drone missions in Afghanistan.

#### 'Nuns on the Bus' will hit the road for immigration reform - Religious News Service

The "Nuns on the Bus" are revving up their engines for another national campaign, only this time the Catholic sisters are taking their mobile platform for social justice along the country's Southern border to push Congress to pass immigration reform.

**U.S. Reforms Could Slash African Immigration Levels** - InterPress Service

Advocates for the African diaspora in the United States have stepped up a campaign to urge the U.S. Congress not to end a longstanding visa programme aimed at boosting immigration from "underrepresented countries".

#### An Imperfect Immigration Bill Survives - New York Times

The bipartisan immigration bill that passed the Senate Judiciary Committee on Tuesday has many serious hurdles ahead. It is the most serious and worthy attempt to fix immigration in a generation, but it cannot help reflecting the poisoned politics of today, with its heavy tilt toward needless border enforcement and a deficiency in equal rights.

# **Trafficking**

Comic book tackles wage theft with goal of empowering aggrieved workers - Catholic News Service Worker advocates have turned to a new tool to educate low-wage employees about wage theft. The first issue of "Wage Theft: Crime & Justice," published by Chicago-based Interfaith Worker Justice, may not be coveted by comic book collectors, but clients at worker centers around the country are poring over the bilingual book to learn how best to regain wages owed to them by deceitful employers.

#### Brazil Lagging in Fight against Human Trafficking - InterPress Service

In contravention of international law, in Brazil trafficking in human beings remains invisible and unpunished, which encourages the practice of trafficking for sexual exploitation, forced labour, illegal adoption and the trade in human organs, according to experts.

#### Trafficking gang 'smuggled Bangladeshis into Brazil' - BBC

Brazilian police say they have identified a gang specialising in trafficking Bangladeshi nationals into the country. About 80 workers have been lured by their own countrymen with promises of earning up to \$1,500 (£985) a month.

#### **Environment**

#### Religious activists hold mining companies to account - Independent Catholic News

Religious activists have become increasingly important in challenging large-scale destructive mining practices around the world. Last week they were protesting prominently outside the annual general shareholder meetings of Rio Tinto and Anglo-American. They supported a representative of Mongolian herders who claimed that a \$5bn (£3.3bn) expansion of Rio Tinto's Oyu Tolgoi copper and gold mine in the Gobi desert threatens the fresh water supply of hundreds of nomadic people and the area's unique ecology.

#### Launch of the Short Circuit Report - London Mining Network

A new report, launched in Westminster by The Gaia Foundation and allies including London Mining Network, exposes the social and ecological atrocities and the toxic legacy of gadgets such as smartphones and laptops. From environmental destruction and contamination caused by extraction, exploitative working conditions during production, to the mountains of e-waste being shipped abroad, the report follows the birth, life and death of everyday gadgets and reveals their true cost to the planet and to future generations.

#### Rich Countries Drag Feet at Climate Talks - InterPress Service

#### Church

US Bishops urge government to publicly discuss and rethink use of Drones - Independent Catholic News The United States should publicly discuss and scrutinize its policy of targeted killings by unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), or drones, in order formulate "a more comprehensive, moral and effective policy to resist terrorism," said the chairman of the US bishops' Committee on International Justice and Peace in a letter to National Security Adviser Thomas Donilon.

Bishops say health, retirement reforms should not contribute to poverty - Catholic News Service Reforms in health and retirement programs such as Medicare, Medicaid and Social Security must not increase poverty or economic hardship among the people they are designed to help, the chairman of two U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops committees said in a letter to Congress. Bishop Stephen E. Blaire of Stockton, Calif., chairman of the Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, and Bishop Richard E. Pates of Des Moines, Iowa, chairman of the Committee on International Justice and Peace, cautioned in the April 22 letter against shifting the cost of such programs to or diminishing benefits of vulnerable seniors, people with disabilities and the poor.

#### Brazil

Brazil court shelves latest trial in Dayton nun's slaying - Dayton Daily News

Brazil's Supreme Court has annulled the trial of a rancher convicted of ordering the 2005 murder of U.S. nun and Amazon people's advocate Dorothy Stang. The court ruled Vitalmiro Moura was not given enough time to prepare his defense in 2010 when he was sentenced to 30 years in prison. The court said Moura will remain behind bars until he is retried at a yet-to be scheduled date.

# Congo

<u>U.S.-trained Congolese troops committed rapes and other atrocities, U.N. says</u> - Washington Post A Congolese army battalion that received its formative training from the U.S. military went on to commit mass rapes and other atrocities last year, a U.N. investigation has found.

#### Britain

Hundreds of Religious urge MPs to prioritise global hunger - Independent Catholic News More than 250 members of religious orders, priests and lay associates lobbied their members of parliament to push for action on global hunger, yesterday, as part of the Enough Food for Everyone IF campaign. Organised by CAFOD - in conjunction with JPIC Religious Links, the Africa-Europe Faith and Justice Network, Progressio and others - the lobby came ahead of June's G8 summit which is held in the UK only once every eight years.

For Kenya, when it rains, it pours destruction all over - Daily Nation

At least 40 people have been killed in Rift Valley, 21 in Eastern Kenya, seven in the coastal region, four in Western and two in central Kenya. As a result of the urgent humanitarian work needed, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) has appealed to the international community for about Sh290 million to support Kenya Red Crioss as it scales up assistance for the affected communities.

#### Cardinal says country in 'jeopardy' - Independent Catholic News

Catholic charity Aid to the Church in Need invited Cardinal John Onaiyekan, Archbishop of Abuja, and Bishop Matthew Hassan Kukah of Sokoto to meet with officers of the European Union to reveal the scale of the problems facing one of the EU's three priority countries in sub-Saharan Africa. Cardinal Onaiyekan told the delegates: "Growing corruption and religious violence jeopardise the west African country of Nigeria".

#### Nigeria attack: Nasarawa cult ambush 'kills 23 police' - BBC

At least 23 police officers in Nigeria have been killed in an ambush by a local militia in the central Nasarawa state. They were on their way to arrest the leader of the outlawed Ombatse "cult" when gunmen opened fire.

#### Nigeria declares 'massive' military campaign on borders - BBC

Nigeria has sent a "massive deployment of men and resources" to combat Islamist militants in three north-eastern states.

A statement said the drive was aimed at "asserting the nation's territorial integrity" and "enhancing security".

# "We propose development within a framework of respect for the rights of indigenous peoples" - Latin America Press

The municipality of Río Negro, located in the province of Satipo, in the central region of Junín, is today recognized as a model of Good Living governance. This is one of the first experiences of the institutionalization of indigenous representation in local government and has also become a model for many municipalities in Peru. In 2012, the municipality was recognized with the National Prize for Good Practices in Public Management, awarded each year by the Peruvian institution Citizens Up to Date (CAD), for its work on social inclusion.
