THREE FAITHS - ONE SITE

The most important institutions in our neighbourhood are religious, cultural and historical: the Juma Musjid (mosque), the Gandhi Library, the Hindu Surat Building, the Victoria Street Market, and of course Emmanuel Cathedral and the Denis Hurley Centre. What links these sites is that they all played significant roles in SA's liberation struggle. Now they have decided to campaign as one Liberation Heritage Route (LHR) site to improve the whole precinct and neighbourhood. Our plan is to jointly seek international recognition from UNESCO because of the strong interfaith bonds which bind us together. Facilitating the process is Thami Nxasana, an advisor to the National Heritage Council (NHC), with extensive experience of working on liberation heritage sites in places such as Robben Island, the Waterfront in Cape Town, and the Newtown Precinct in Johannesburg.
